### VETTING

### POSITIONING

Umpires need to be :-

1. In the **RIGHT PLACE**
2. At the **RIGHT TIME**
3. to make the **RIGHT OBSERVATION**
4. to lead to the **RIGHT DECISION**

It would be very easy to say that X marks the spot for the umpire at any given situation within the game - but we umpires never take the easy road, do we? Every umpire has a different stature, variations of eyesight and differing levels of speed and fitness. So each umpire has to find their own position - one where they feel comfortable and obtain the best view of play.

Anticipation has a great deal to do with positioning. If umpires are alert to the movement of the game they will be aware of what could happen at any one given moment and be ready to move accordingly. The more experienced umpires become the better their levels of anticipation and the fewer 50 yard sprints they need to do.

Some useful "rules":

1. Never turn your back on play or take your eyes off play.
2. Try not to make decisions on the run.
3. Never let play get ahead of you.
4. Don't go after the ball!

### DISCIPLINARY CODE

In the last Newsletter I told you to ask your Club Secretary for a copy of the AE Disciplinary Code. I hope you did!

As it is a lengthy document here are brief details:

1. The code applies to **all** games except friendlies. A match report form should be completed for all games (Indoor and Outdoor).
2. A red card shall be given to a player who offers or uses violence towards an umpire or player. She is then prohibited from playing for a minimum of 30 days (see code for details).
3. If a yellow card is given to a player on 3 occasions, she is prohibited from playing for a minimum of 30 days.
4. The club is responsible for reporting any penalty. The umpire is responsible for completing the match report correctly and filling out the "Red Card" form.
